ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (Describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within the community.)

A gable roof bungalow with front roof dormer having a triple light over a porch with gently arched enclosure. Both roof eaves are supported on stick-style construction.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (Explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community.) This bungalow was built by Henry E. and Beatrice M. Beaudry in 1924 on land they purchased perhaps in 1919 from Newell. They moved from 957 Chicopee, in part probably to be closer to his work at C.F. Church as a cabinetmaker. They continued to live there through 1945. In 1981 the house was owned by Henry N. and Anita H. Beaudry.
