CHICOPEE

Was once a part of Springfield proper, and now so closely allied to it in its business and social relations, as to still make it substantially a prominent branch of the growing family which cling to "the old folks at home." It has, nevertheless, a name and fame of its own, most worthily won, and in point of industry, enterprise and intelligent thrift, ranks among the first New England manufacturing towns.

We append a brief sketch of many of its prominent industries and business establishments :

THE DWIGHT MANUFACTURING COMPANY.

Of the manufacturing interests of Chicopee, the Dwight Company is the most important, occupying seven large mills, and furnishing employment, at the present time, to 1,500 operatives. It was organized about 1833, with a capital of \$1,200,000 which has remained unchanged to the present time. The first mill was begun July 15, 1833; the last one June 8, 1844. Originally, there were three separate corporations, but these were early combined in one. The total number of spindles, now in operation, is 110,000, of looms, 2,671. The stock is nearly all owned in Boston, as it has been from the first, and the avowed policy of the management is to allow the outside world the least possible knowledge of their affairs. John A. Vernon of Boston, is president, H. Howard Nichols of the same city, treasurer, G. W. Bedlow, agent, and Minot, Hooper & Co., of Boston and New York, are the selling agents.

THE AMES MANUFACTURING COMPANY.

Second in magnitude of its operations, though first in public interest, is the Ames Company, located on the Chicopee River, just above the Dwight Company's mills, and close by the Center Depot, on the Chicopee Falls branch. It was organized in 1842, with a capital of \$30,000, James T. Ames and N. P. Ames, of Chicopee, and J. K. Mills, Edmund Dwight, founder of the Dwight Manufacturing Company, and Ignatius Sargent of Boston, being the principal stockholders. Mr. Dwight was its first president. Its early history shows a steady growth and repeated enlargement of its Capital until in 1850, it reached the sum of \$250,000, its present figure. During the war, from 1500 to 1600 hands were employed, and large supplies of cannon, swords, and projectiles were furnished the government. In 1867, a change in the management occurred, Messrs. Emerson Gaylord, T. W. Carter and E. O. Carter of Chicopee, securing, with Mr. James T. Ames, a majority of the stock, and transferring the head-quarters of the Company from Boston to Chicopee.

Mr. Ames, who had previously been the Company's agent, now became its president, and held the position till January, 1872, when Emerson Gaylord was chosen as his successor, and held the place until last January, when a majority of the stock having been previously purchased by Clifford Arrick, of Washington, D. C., and Mr. A. C. Woodworth, son-in-law of Mr. Ames, there was another change in the management, and Mr. Arrick was chosen president, Mr. Woodworth agent, A. G. Bowles, of Boston, treasurer, and Messrs. Arrick and Woodworth, with Nathaniel Hooper, of

Boston, A. G. Dexter and James T. Ames, directors, with E. O. Carter as clerk. A short time before his death, Hon. Samuel Hooper, of Boston, purchased a large interest, his stock being subsequently bought by Messrs. Arrick and Woodworth.

The new president will be remembered for his sharp contest with General Dyer, two or three years ago, and is best known in military circles as the owner of the Eureka projectile which is now being tested by the ordinance department at Washington; so far with very satisfactory results. Should the government approve this projectile, its manufacture will be brought to these works and insure a material increase of the present working force of 350. At present the Company is manufacturing bronze statuary, for which the works are widely noted, fancy swords of which from 50 to 100 per day are produced, machinists' tools and special machinery. The whole history of the Company has been a prosperous one, the dividends from January, 1847, to April, 1871, aggregating 432 per cent. During the war and immediately after they ranged from 20 to 35 per cent.

In September, 1875, the death of Mr. Arrick caused a vacancy in the presidency of the Company, as also in the board of directors. Mr. James T. Ames was elected president for the unexpired term, of Mr. Arrick, and was also re-elected in January, 1876, the other officers remaining the same as in previous years.

THE GAYLORD MANUFACTURING COMPANY.

The Gaylord Company, manufacturers of cabinet locks and malleable iron castings, are located just above the works of the Ames Company. Their corporate existence dates back only from 1863, but their business dates back to 1856, when Emerson Gaylord, who for fifteen years previous had been employed as a workman and contractor for the Ames Company, bought out its interest in the manufacture of military accoutrements, fire hose and leather belting, and set up for himself, employing only three or four hands. In July, 1859, he received the contract for the construction of all the mail bags used by the general government, a contract renewed in 1863 and again in 1867, and this at once gave a great impetus to his business. At the opening of the war the government called upon him for supplies, a new mill was erected, the working force increased to 400, and every nerve strained to meet the demand. Growing out of this came the organization of the Company having a capital stock of \$100,000, with Emerson Gaylord as president, Jerome Wells as treasurer, and Messrs. Gaylord, Wells, T. W. Carter, James T. Ames and E. N. Snow as directors. Like most institutions of the class they reaped a rich harvest from the war, and after it was over were in good shape to undertake the manufacture of cabinet locks, a difficult and rarely successful work, but one in which their success was all that could be wished. They now make over 2,000,000 locks per year, in 350 styles. The Company has undergone few changes. Sereno Gaylord, brother of Emerson, succeeded Mr. Wells as treasurer in 1864, and was succeeded by A. F. Gaylord, son of the president of the Company, in 1870. The firm at present employ about 60 hands. James L. Pease is agent of the corporation. In July, 1875, the Company added to their business, that of the manufacture of swords, which is now successfully prosecuted, employing twenty-five men, with a fair prospect of an increase of business in the future.

S. BLAISDELL, JR., & CO.

A business wonderful in its growth, and remarkable in its prosperity, is that of S. Blaisdell, Jr. & Co., whose modest office is close by the Chicopee Junction Depot. Its origin dates back to 1863, when George Mattoon and Andrew Hubbard engaged in the cotton waste business, at Chicopee Falls. Mr. Hubbard died not long after, and in 1865 it was removed to Chicopee, and Mr. Mattoon continued the business alone, until 1868, when S. Blaisdell, Jr., joined him, the firm name being Mattoon & Blaisdell, and so continuing until Mr. Mattoon's retirement in May, 1872. At the time the new co-partnership was formed, the firm had a capital of \$10,000, and did a yearly business of from \$30,000 to \$50,000. In less than two years, this was increased over 100 per cent., and

the two following years saw it again doubled. Since that time, its growth has been even more rapid, and during the twelve months ending April 30, 1875, the sales aggregated more than a million of dollars, those for the last three months of it reaching the sum of \$350,000. The capital stock is now \$150,000. The freight bills of the firm for the year, were upwards of \$37,000; their telegraph bills, 75 per cent. of the total business of the town. The cotton waste business has long been one of secondary importance, their trade being principally in cotton itself, which they receive direct from the cotton sheds, through every port in the South, from Norfolk, Va., to New Orleans and Galveston. They make a specialty of supplying extra fine cotton to manufacturers of fine underwear, and deal largely in fine waste, to be mixed with wool for spinning purposes. They do likewise a considerable business in paper stock and paper, and anticipate, for the coming year, a trade largely in excess of anything hitherto. The firm at present consists of the three brothers, S. Jr., Charles M. and George A. Blaisdell.

CARRIAGE MANUFACTURING.

Half a mile west of the Chicopee Junction Depot of the Connecticut River Railroad, and in plain view of it, is the extensive carriage manufacturing establishment of Edson Clark. The business was started about twenty years ago, in two buildings; one sixty feet in length, and two stories in height, and the other sixty-five feet long, and a story and a half high. The works at present occupy four separate buildings, two and three stories high, and respectively, one hundred by twenty-five feet, ninety by twenty-five, eighty-five by twenty-five, and sixty-five by thirty-five. About thirty men are employed, and the business done exceeds that of any other carriage manufactory in the State, outside of Boston, amounting yearly to something more than \$40,000. All sorts of light work, buggies, carryalls, etc., are built, and nothing is allowed to go out which is not in every respect first-class work. Most of the workmen are employed steadily, year in and year out, instead of being discharged at the close of the busy season, insuring a reliable force of competent men at all times.

In the same line is the establishment of W. H. Gilmore, at the intersection of Sumner and Cross streets, just outside the business section of Chicopee. A single small building, now used as a wood shop, sufficed for its beginnings in 1842, since which it has been three times enlarged, and the two or three hands, at first employed, have been increased to from eighteen to twenty-five, according to the demands of the season. Formerly Mr. Gilmore was engaged largely in building heavy wagons, his goods having the very highest reputation, and being sold largely at the South. Recently he has confined himself principally to lighter work, his sales some years reaching \$40,000 or more, but has never sacrificed his reputation for perfect material and honest work. His goods are mostly marketed in this vicinity, though occasional sales are made at the West and south, and some have been sent as far off as California.

BYRT & BULLENS.

Byrt & Bullens, tanners and curriers, do business on the bank of the Connecticut river, opposite the Chicopee Junction depot, and have been so occupied for the past twelve years, employing from five to ten men and using from 100 to 200 sides of leather weekly, mostly calf-skins, their business being principally in harness and suspender leather.

BOBBINS.

B. F. McLean, (successor to B. Leavitt,) having removed the business from the old establishment between the Ames and Gaylord works on the south side of the river, last November, is now located in the building known as Wood's grist-mill, on the north side of the river, where ample facilities are furnished for the manufacture of cotton and wool bobbins. Mr. McLean is now doing a larger business than his predecessor, with a prospect of a still larger increase.

ATTORNEYS.

At the head of the local bar, is George D. Robinson, for nearly twenty years a resident of the town, a practicing lawyer for the past nine years, and for a like number previously, principal of the High School. Mr. Robinson was a member of the Legislature of 1874, and was last Fall a candidate for a second term, when he ran largely ahead of his ticket, but failed of an election. In November last he was elected to go "up higher," being now a senator from the 2d Hampden district. His office is in Cabot Hall block.

In the same block is the office of Luther White, for the past five or six years a successful practitioner. He is a young man yet, and has held no public office except that of school committee.

L. E. Hitchcock, was admitted to the bar about two years ago. He is now in the office of George D. Robinson.

Jonathan Allen, a graduate of the office of E. B. Maynard, of Springfield, has been in practice in Chicopee about eighteen months. He has just opened an office in Burke's new block on lower Exchange street.

M. F. Moriarty, recently admitted to the bar, has an office over S. W. Parshley's store, corner of Exchange and Cabot streets.

BAKERY.

Chicopee's only bakery is that of W. C. Wedge & Co., who have been in business for the past fourteen years on Center street. As patentees and manufacturers of Wedge's rotary oven, the firm has a reputation far beyond its local limits.

BANKS.

The First National, formerly the Cabot Bank, has a capital of \$150,000, with a large surplus. The following are its officers: President, Jerome Wells; cashier, F. B. Doten; directors, Jerome Wells, T. W. Carter, Emerson Gaylord, Erastus Stebbins, E. O. Carter, Sidney Chapin and L. M. Ferry. The Cabot Bank was instituted March 1, 1845, John Chase being its first president.

The Chicopee Savings Bank was organized in 1854 with Jerome Wells as president and Henry H. Harris as treasurer. The latter has held his office ever since. Mr. Wells retired at the close of last year. The present official board is constituted as follows: President, George D. Robinson; vice-presidents, E. O. Carter, A. G. Parker, Emerson Gaylord, G. H. Chapman; secretary, George V. Wheelock; treasurer, Henry H. Harris; trustees, Benning Leavitt, J. A. Denison, George S. Taylor, N. Cutler, John B. Wood, C. M. Kendall, E. Stebbins, Lewis M. Ferry, John Dixon, George V. Wheelock, A. S. Hunter, A. F. Gaylord. The present location is in Kendall's new block, opposite the Town Hall, to which it removed in December last, having previously been kept in the same building with the First National Bank. It has at present 1,800 depositors with an aggregate of \$460,000 deposits.

BOOKS, NEWS AND STATIONERY.

E. M. Alden, Merchants' row, is proprietor of the only bookstore in Chicopee, combined with which is an extensive circulating library, and large stationery and newspaper department. Mr. Alden has been engaged in his present business, which he has built up with much energy, since 1870. He is, and has been for many years, the local agent of the American Express Company.

J. Stackpole, an old and esteemed resident of the town, opened about a year ago a news and variety store on Center street. Mr. Stackpole makes the sale and repairing of clocks something of a specialty. He has lately taken a partner, the firm at present being J. Stackpole & Co.

BARBER SHOPS.

Three barbers do the legitimate shaving for Chicopee people, Charles H. Blackmer, who has prominent and attractive quarters in Temple's block, George H. Grooms and T. W. Cronin.

BOOTS AND SHOES.

Prominent in this line is Mr. W. L. Blackmer, who came to Chicopee in 1861, and after four years' service in the employ of the Gaylord Manufacturing Company opened a fancy goods store on the site of the Masonic Hall block. This he sold in 1869, and entered upon his present business on Exchange street. Mr. Blackmer does a large custom business in men's fine work.

Farther down Exchange street J. O'Donnell is doing a considerable business in boots and shoes.

Other prominent dealers are Chapman & Folsom, S. W. Parshley, W. P. Beals and George Beesley, corner Exchange and Miller streets.

COAL.

Carlos Allen, the popular coal dealer, has his office in Temple's block, and does a large business. A. B. Abbey, R. W. Bemis and John Dixon are also engaged in it.

CONCRETE PAVING.

Messrs. Mead & Richards are engaged in the business of putting down the popular concrete paving, and will respond promptly to orders from any part of the country.

CUSTOM AND READY-MADE CLOTHING.

In the line of custom clothing, Chicopee has something to be proud of in the establishment of J. P. Buckingham, who has been engaged in the business there over 20 years, sometimes, as at present, alone, though more frequently with a partner. He formerly kept a line of ready-made clothing, but now limits himself to custom work and furnishings. Mr. Buckingham usually employs from twelve to fifteen hands.

J. M. Lane and B. Moffit are engaged in the same business.

Hitchcock & Hosley are the only American house engaged in the ready-made clothing business. The senior partner, Harvey Hitchcock, started the business about twelve years ago at the stand now occupied by the firm, and in May, 1866, was joined by Mr James E. Hosley. They deal to some extent in boots and shoes, and are located in Bullens' block on Exchange street.

L. Fisher dealer in ready-made clothing, Kent's block Exchange street, has been in the business about three years.

DRUG STORES.

Chicopee's three drug stores are all of long standing, but the honor of seniority among the present dealers belongs to W. W. Johnson, who has been engaged in the business in Cabot Hall block, on Market square since August, 1861. Mr. Johnson has been a resident of the town for 40 years, and was postmaster during the administrations of Presidents Pierce and Buchanan.

Warren Smith has occupied his present stand on Exchange street for the past ten years. He has been a resident of Chicopee most of the time since 1853.

Hooker & Co., are later comers, occupying the Exchange street store where Dr. Roudez was previously located.

DRY GOODS.

The house of Warren S. Bragg & Co., having been dissolved, the Company consisting of Jerome Wells and F. B. Doten, cashier of the First National Bank, continue the business, which is confessedly the leading one in the dry goods trade in Chicopee. Located on the corner of Exchange street and Market square, on the site where it was first established by Mr. Wells nearly forty years ago, it occupies three large and commodious stores in Cabot Hall block, one being devoted to dry goods, the second to the

carpet trade, and the third to the hardware business. From a yearly business of \$40,000 in 1865, the firm showed one of \$110,000 in 1873, and now count safely upon one of \$100,000 or more yearly.

A. J. Jenks was formerly with Bragg & Co., but went into business for himself on the opposite side of Exchange street, about three years ago. Later he bought out Hale & Oakes and removed to the stand in Bullens' block on the same street, formerly occupied by them, and still later Mr. Jenks bought out Mr. J. B. Wood in October, 1875, at the corner of Exchange and Center streets, where he is now doing a prosperous business.

C. H. Merrick on Exchange street, and J. B. Hammersly, Merchants' row are the only other dealers of note.

FURNITURE.

The furniture business in Chicopee is limited to the spacious warerooms of Lafayette Temple in Temple's block on Center street. Years ago the business was carried on by Josiah Whitney, and afterwards passed into the hands of Hosley & Co., Mr. Temple being the junior member of the firm for nine years, and for the past four months sole proprietor. He carries a stock valued at from \$12,000 to \$13,000, and does a large undertakers' and picture frame business. The establishment has always done a safe and fairly remunerative trade.

GROCERIES.

The Bullens family were the pioneers in the grocery business of Chicopee, and are identified more than any others with its mercantile history. As far back as 1838, the business was established by the four brothers, E., A., I. and I. M., on the site now occupied by Isaac Bullens & Sons, on the corner of Exchange and Cabot streets. Their business was immense for those times, amounting to \$100,000 a year, and they were reckoned the largest retail grocers in the State outside of Boston. Later the brothers separated, each taking a separate line of the business. The Junior member of the late firm of I. Bullens & Sons, is I. Newton Bullens, who has been associated with his father for some twenty-three years. All the American grocers in Chicopee were trained in this store. I. Newton Bullens does a large business, and carries a considerable line of crockery.

C. A. Bullens, representing another branch of the family, also conducts a large grocery business near by, and is proprietor of Exchange Hall, which has a seating capacity of about 400.

Carter & Spaulding at present do the largest grocery business in Chicopee, their location on Market square being one of the best in the town, and their business having increased every year since they first opened. The present firm dates back ten years Mr. Carter having been in the business alone for three years preceding.

Other prominent dealers in this branch are P. Rourke, corner of West and Emerald streets, and Lanckton & Pond, on Exchange street.

HOTELS.

The Cabot House, kept for the past eleven years by W. H. Dickinson, is located on Front street opposite the Town Hall, and close by the Center depot. It is well kept, and has a good feeding stable connected with it.

The Chicopee House, kept by Merrick Abbey, is near the Junction depot.

JEWELRY.

C. F. Kent, near the head of Exchange street, carries a well selected \$10,000 stock of watches and jewelry. Previous to entering on his present business, Mr. Kent kept a drug store for fifteen or twenty years.

E. A. Gallupe occupies a portion of E. M. Alden's store on Market Square, and carries on a watch repairing and general jewelry business.

LIVERY STABLES.

W. E. Wheeler has carried on a large livery business at his Exchange street stand for the past ten years, and for a year past has combined with it a considerable trade in harness and trunks. He also supplies brass foundries largely with sand for cores, his trade in this line reaching from Montreal to Philadelphia.

W. H. Dickinson's stable, near Mr. Wheeler's, is also an old and prosperous stand as are those of R. Corey in the same vicinity, and Merrick Abbey, who is located at the Chicopee House, near the Junction depot.

MEAT AND FISH.

The oldest meat market is that of J. A. Denison & Co., on Cabot street, where it has been established for thirty years or more. Mr. Denison himself withdrew from the business in 1873, leaving the firm name to the present proprietors, John D. White, W. P. Ferry and A. E. Jones.

J. U. McClench is also one of the veteran marketmen of the town, having been for many years on Center street, and lately in his new block on Exchange street.

W. S. Wood has lately started the business on Center street, where he is building up a prosperous trade.

Stoddard & Stedman have been in the same line for five or six years.

The fish and oyster business is carried on by Quimby & Beckwith, who, not long since, bought out George Barrett's old stand on Exchange street, and by Farrar & Grant, who are located on Center street, near the head of Exchange.

Vincent & Mayo have started a neat little fish and oyster market on Exchange street, near Cabot street.

MILLINERY.

Misses A. & A. McQuade have not been long in the millinery business, but are building up a large and prosperous trade at their establishment in Dixon's block on the corner of Exchange and Dwight streets.

Other millinery houses are those of Mrs. A. B. Bagg, Miss A. J. Fuller, John Colby, and J. & M. Follis. Mrs. Dow has very neat millinery rooms on Cabot street, C. D. Marth has opened a store stocked with millinery and fancy goods on Exchange street.

PAINTERS.

W. D. Manchester & Co., Center street, do all kinds of painting and decorative paper hanging. Mr. Manchester has been engaged in the business for eight years, most of the time without a partner, and has prospered.

F. O. & W. H. Dayton, painters and paper hangers, at their shop on Exchange street, have a variety of goods in their line.

PHOTOGRAPHER.

The only picture gallery in Chicopee is a portable one at the corner of Exchange and Perkins streets, where, although movable, it has remained stationary for the last three years.

PLASTERERS.

Few men of any station in life, are more highly esteemed than the veteran, Charles Sherman, who is responsible for a great many first-class jobs in Chicopee and Springfield within the last forty years.

Michael McDermot, in the same line of business, is also reliable for good work, and Captain McClallan whom everybody knows is busy and attentive to business as ever, although now seventy-three years old.

NEW BUILDINGS.

W. C. Wedge is building a three story brick block on Center street, adjoining Temple's block. It is three stories high and designed for two stores on the first floor,

one of which will be occupied as a sales room by W. C. Wedge & Co., for the finer goods in their line. The upper floors will be fitted up for tenements.

PRINTING.

G. V. Wheelock, the only job printer in Chicopee, is located in Cabot Hall block, does good work, and keeps two men steadily employed.

RESTAURANT.

The need of an up-town restaurant has been met by Mr. C. N. Manchester, who has just opened on Center street, nearly opposite Temple block, the most finely fitted up dining-rooms the town has yet known.

STOVES AND TINWARE.

H. Cogswell has been for the past six years located at the old stand, on Exchange street, where William G. Bliss, for a quarter of a century previous, carried on the stove and tinware business. Mr. Cogswell came originally from Keene, N. H., and before going to Chicopee, had charge of the work department of D. B. Montague's establishment at Springfield. He manufactures tinware extensively, and does a large business otherwise.

A. M. Moore, successor to Southworth & Moore, is located, in a handsome brick block, on the north side of Exchange street, and divides the stove trade with Mr. Cogswell. This establishment, like that of the latter, dates back a number of years, though it has passed through several changes, Mr. Simon G. Southworth retiring from the firm about a year ago.

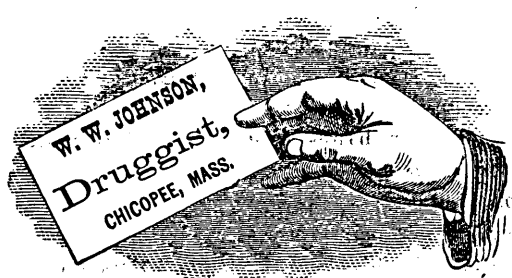

Places Worthy of Notice from Strangers.

THE UNITED STATES ARMY, on State street, is described on another page. Principal entrance to the grounds, corner State and Byers streets. Passes are required for admission to the arsenal or shops, and may be obtained at the office. Visitors see here the most perfect works for gun-making, great stores of arms, many mementoes of war, (including marks of the fight here in the Shays rebellion) and views of the surrounding country from the top of the arsenal.

THE CITY HALL, fronting Court Square, erected at an expense of \$100,000, ranks among the finest buildings in New England. It has an audience room capable of holding 3,000 persons, and accommodations for most of the city officers.

THE CEMETERY, in the south-easterly part of the city, has its main entrance from Maple street, near its junction with Central street, with an entrance for carriages also

from Pine street, and for people on foot from Mulberry and from Union streets. Although within the city, it is so secluded its existence would hardly be suspected by a stranger. On a portion of it, the forest trees still grow, and "Nature vies with Art in producing one of the most charming combinations of hill and valley, stream and fountain, trees and flowers, slopes and terraces, and winding footpaths and open carriage-ways imaginable." There are forty acres in the grounds.

HAMPDEN PARK, north of B. & A. R. R., between the Connecticut river and Fulton street; having one entrance from Clinton street, and another from Plainfield street. Inaugurated September 29, 1857. Purchased and improved by the Hampden County Agricultural Society at a cost of \$31,600, for an exhibition ground, and leased by the Hampden Park Association.

NOTES ON THE MANUFACTURING AND MERCANTILE INTERESTS.

The Belcher & Taylor Agricultural Tool Company have extended their reputation as builders of good tools for farmers, to distant parts of the country. The works are located on the north bank of the Chicopee River, which furnishes the power required for the whole village. This Company manufactures Bullard's hay tedders and rakes, and Stoddard's new balance rake. They also make garden barrows, and that popular cylinder plow formerly made at Greenfield, Mass. The New York feed cutter is one of their specialties, while other implements needed on the farm, such as horse hoes, tobacco ridgers, corn shellers, vegetable cutters, road scrapers and warehouse trucks are included in the variety of goods made by this well-known house. Perhaps the self-sharpening feed cutter is as curious and practical as any implement of this age. The Company have sold over forty thousand of them and still the demand is great. The Company also make the conical or silver medal plow, and the right hand corn sheller, the latter shelling corn as easily and rapidly as other shellers when worked by two hands. George S. Taylor is the agent, who resides at Chicopee Falls.

Just across the road, on the same side of the river, stands the gun manufactory of J. Stevens & Co. Here are made all kinds of sporting rifles, shot guns, pistols, blunderbusses, etc. The new sporting rifle, the invention of Mr. Stevens, is a very valuable gun. There is a shot-gun barrel which can be used in place of the rifled one. Stevens & Co., manufacture a very fine breech-loading shot gun, and pocket-rifles with barrels from six to eighteen inches long. We have seen some of the targets perforated by the shots from his rifles, in one case as many as fifty shots within a space of three inches radius, from a distance of four rods. J. Stevens & Co., send these guns to the far West and to the Canadas, there being much demand for them among hunters and sporting people. This company has just commenced the manufacture of a new and beautiful double barrel shot gun, which is destined to become very popular with the sporting fraternity, those who are curious in such matters will do well to look in upon the works of this company.

B. & J. W. Belcher have their works on the south side of the river. These parties are successors to the old and well-known firm of Whittemore, Belcher & Co. A specialty of this Company is their new lever cutter, patented May 25, 1875, a cut of which can be seen in another part of this book. They also make hide roll hay cutters with both spiral and straight knife, and various kinds of corn shellers. The celebrated Does' plow, with convex mould-board, is made here, and also here is to be found the A 100 swivel plow that has taken so many premiums in plowing contests and they exhibited at the Centennial, the well-known Ellis Plow, which proves to be one of the best. As you walk through their shops and warehouses, you see cultivators, harrows, road scrapers, wheel-barrows, etc., finished and being shipped to market.

In the line of agricultural tools, Chicopee Falls has a reputation very flattering to the enterprise of her manufacturers, even in the most distant parts of the country.

Our grandmothers would look with astonishment upon the machines for knitting stockings, could they walk into the manufactory of the Lamb Knitting Machine Company, located at Chicopee Falls. Here are made thousands of that most useful ma-

chine, whose skill in knitting stockings has well-nigh banished the old-fashioned knitting needles from the land. With one of these machines, hose, gloves and mittens are knit without a seam. It takes only thirty minutes to knit a pair of socks. We learn that this Company have sold over 20,000 of these machines, and that they are to be found in every corner of the land. Another very useful article is also made by this Company, and that is the Dover egg beater. Over 800 gross of these little implements have been sold, and we never knew a housewife who did not say they were just what was wanted in the kitchen. Marion Harland gives this beater great praise in her late work, "Breakfast, Dinner and Tea." She says: "I do not know whether 'Dover' stands for his name, that of the manufacturing company, or the place in which it was made. 'Dover Egg Beater, patented 1870,' is stamped upon the circumference of the iron wheel. I know nothing more of its antecedents, but if I could not get another, I would not sell mine for fifty dollars."

One of the neatest and pleasantest bleacheries we ever visited is that of Anderton & Dunn, at Chicopee Falls. This enterprising firm have been fortunate in finding a spring of remarkably pure water, and have located their buildings so as to get the full benefit of this spring. For some time past this bleachery was confined to the bleaching of cloth produced at this place, and the superior cotton flannels from the Chicopee Manufacturing Company, which took the lead in the New York market on account of their purity and whiteness, owed their distinction to the bleaching they had received by Messrs. Anderton & Dunn. They are now prepared to do bleaching for all manufacturers, and are receiving orders from Holyoke, Indian Orchard, and other places. They are rapidly extending a very enviable reputation as bleachers.

The Chicopee Manufacturing Company is the largest of those at this village. Here are made shirtings, sheetings, flannels, cotton flannels, quilts, printers' cloths. Their machinery is so varied that they can make cloth from twenty-eight inches to three and one-half yards in width. There are 1,200 hands employed. The main building, 438 feet long by 94 feet wide and four stories high, was erected in 1874. They have built a large addition as shown on the map. The Picker building is 100 feet by 40 feet. These are flanked by other buildings. The total production for six months previous to June 1st, 1875, were five and one-half millions of yards. The yearly productions are about 11 millions yards. G. H. Jones succeeds J. W. Osgood, as agent, with T. P. Wattles, as superintendent, who manages the affairs principally here. The treasurer of the Company is Henry Saltonstall, 15 Chauncey street, Boston. Selling agents are: E. R. Mudge, Sawyer & Co., 15 Chauncey street, Boston, and 43 White street, New York.

The Massachusetts Arms Company, located here, has secured a national reputation by the manufacture of various kinds of breech-loading fire-arms for the United States, and for foreign governments.

The operations of the Company are now chiefly confined to the production of the improved Maynard breech-loading and combination rifles and shot guns. Parkers improved central fire and re-loading cartridge cases, together with the Berdan Primer, are used in connection with their arms, by means of which they are rendered peculiarly valuable, where certainty and rapidity of discharge are desirable.

Important improvements have recently been made in the model of the sporting arms, which have heretofore been regarded as in many respects superior to any others; and the Company is now enlarging its works for the purpose of supplying a large demand for its latest models of rifles, especially designed for meeting the requirements of the "Creedmoor" regulations, and for other long and midrange practice. The uniform accuracy of their arms, renders them peculiarly popular with members of rifle clubs and sportsmen generally.

The works are under the charge of William P. McFarland, superintendent; T. C. Page, president; T. W. Carter, treasurer.

The latest organization here is the Chicopee Falls Savings Bank. The banking room is in the old office of the Chicopee Manufacturing Company. The bank was incor-

porated in the spring of 1875. The officers are Josiah W. Osgood, president; E. T. Paige, secretary; and A. P. Chapin, treasurer. A full list of trustees and other officers can be found on another page.

Hall & Camp at the "old Hubbard stand," can take credit in the age and fine reputation of their house, it having been known as one of the best for the past thirty years. They make a specialty of doing fine custom clothing work, and claim to have the largest stock in the village.

Eugene Munn, a dealer in dry goods, groceries, etc., has a pretty store opposite Wildes' Hotel, and cultivates a taste for flowers as well as business, his veranda displaying pretty goods but still more pretty flowers.

H. S. Newell takes to the substantial, such as meats, fish and vegetables, and supplies a portion of the town with that essential thing, good food.

P. O. O'Callaghan is the sole proprietor of the head-quarters for boots & shoes. He keeps the best of custom work, makes to measure, and does repairing.

N. R. Wood provides the farmers and every one else with agricultural tools as well as groceries and crockery, and finds low prices not a bad investment in these times.

Darling & Morgan, though on a quiet street, have taught people by the quality of their dry goods, groceries, crockery and hardware to seek them, and their busy store speaks well for the proprietors.

A. P. Chapin succeeds A. W. Page as Postmaster, and also carries on the book, stationery, fruit, jewelry, and watch repairing business. His variety store located with the post-office, has a large number of customers. Mr. Chapin is still the efficient treasurer of the Chicopee Falls Savings Bank.

William Blake looks into the future and sees a snow storm six months ahead, and providentially puts coal into his neighbors' cellars. He also keeps a livery stable, and furnishes carriages for funerals, weddings, etc., and keeps the best of driving horses.

George Wallace can always be found at his post of duty which is his busy tin and stove store. He has everything which his neighbors need when they wish to burn Blake's coal, and tin ware enough for all the cupboards in Chicopee.

Alfred Desotelle, who succeeds Desotelle & Prairie, has a large French trade, although he may be regarded as a live Yankee if we may judge from his business and he is furnishing a good variety of dry goods, groceries, crockery, vegetables, &c.

Edgar T. Paige finds time to run a telegraph office, in the interval of selling drugs and medicines to the sick, and fancy and toilet articles to the well. His chemicals, dye stuffs and Shaker herbs, with a hundred other articles, crowd his little store with everything the people want, and if he don't have just what you ask for, he has but to tap that telegraph wire and the goods come in on the lightning express.

P. W. Smith will have the best grades of clothing, and is a deadly enemy to shoddy, in all its forms. He has the New Jersey shoe, which other dealers don't have, and in this cold climate he finds a good stock of shirts and underwear for gentlemen, a profitable thing at the Falls. Should any one get into a dispute with his neighbor (which of course is very rare in so well ordered a community) about boundary lines, he has but to call on P. W. Smith, who has a chain and all the other instruments for surveying, and the parties soon learn "never to differ any more."

When you are getting your groceries at Darling & Morgan's don't forget that D. M. Cook is in the next store, with meats and vegetables, and can save you many steps.

Elias C. Terry keeps those stoves and ranges, cave-troughs, &c., to sell. He don't mean to house them long.
